Canine Team Training Instructor Course #1199

This eighty-hour program will prepare an officer to obtain their K-9 Team Training Instructor certificate. Officers attending will focus on the role of the canine team instructor and the liability of K-9 training. The course will cover teaching the academics of canine as well as conducting the practical demonstrations. The course will examine the selection process of canine teams. Those who attend should be prepared to participate in physical activity and demonstrate teaching a canine topic.

There is a mandatory attendance policy. Students will be required to pass written examination with minimum <u>85%</u> and demonstrate proficiencies at <u>100%</u>.
