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## Single Response to Active Shooter CJSTC #1402

The term "Active Assailant" has evolved since the Columbine High School mass killing on April 20, 1999. Training related to these mass killings has continued to change throughout the years. The tactics and skills involved are perishable and require continual training to retain them.
