Crisis Intervention Training for SROs #1401

This specialized course mirrors the nationally recognized Memphis Model. It prepares the SRO to respond immediately to a student in crisis.

Officers will learn about common mental health and behavioral issues, de-escalation techniques, involuntary commitment, and supporting students as they re-enter school after treatment. Crisis intervention training is required for all SROs under s. 1006.12(1)(c), F.S. This course is intended to help fulfill that need.
