

Firearms Instructor CJSTC Course #801

This CJSTC course teaches the techniques to become a Certified Firearms Instructor and instruct the Florida Criminal Justice Firearms course. This is a high liability course and is required for instructors desiring to teach in the Basic Law Enforcement Recruit Academy.

It is highly recommended that you practice shooting the CJSTC Law Enforcement Qualification course before taking the CMS Firearms Instructor course. Firearms pre-qualification is completed on the first day. Firearms pre-qualification proficiency of 85% must be achieved and agencies/students that fail to qualify the first day are not eligible for a refund.

Students are required to pass a written test with at least a score of 85%. There is a mandatory 100% attendance policy



Eligibility Required

- Have a general FDLE Instructor certification or be eligible for and apply for the general instructor certification at the same time as the High-Liability Instructor certification
- Three years' experience as a certified criminal justice officer or 3 years' experience in high liability topic of instruction
