IPMBA Public Safety Cyclist for Law Enforcement

This is the 32-hour International Police Mountain Bike Association (IPMBA) certification course that prepares officers to work the street from a bicycle. This course involves a lot of outdoor activity including day and night open street rides, closed course obstacle navigation, scenarios, and basic maintenance.

Students must pass the written and practical examination required for certification.

Personal Equipment Required: Eye protection (shatter-resistant, wraparound, clear and tinted), Bicycle helmet (ANSI, Snell, CPSP approved). Padded cycling gloves

REQUIRED EQUIPMENT:

Duty Bicycle (reputable manufacturer- Mountain bicycle, good working order, properly fitted. Street/off road combination tires, pedal retention devices (BMX style NOT permitted), at least 1 cage & Bottle, 1 personal hydration system recommended, headlight (42 lumens at 10 feet min), steady or flashing red light on rear, rear mounted kick stand, rear rack with full size bag.

DUTY GEAR NEEDED:

Agency uniform with gun belt and gear, comfortable sneakers or bicycle shoes (no lock-in style), Bicycle pants or shorts are recommended, but not required.
