### Lead Instructor

Captain Glenn Luben (retired) began his Law Enforcement career in 1982 when he joined the U.S. Air Force as a Law Enforcement Specialist. In 1986, he joined the Pinellas County Sheriff's Office. During his career with PCSO, he worked as a Patrol Deputy, Patrol Supervisor, Criminal Investigations Detective, and Criminal Investigations Supervisor.
