

Recognize and Respond to Mental Health & Substance Abuse Emergencies CJSTC#1421

Effective July 1, 2021, the legislation requires that the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission (CJSTC) establish standards for instruction of officers in use of force, specifically regarding an officer's ability to recognize and respond to mental illnesses, substance use disorders, and people in crisis at the scene.

The goal of the course is to provide you with a high-level overview of mental health, substance abuse, and crisis emergencies encountered at the scene and strategies for how to effectively respond to those who need help.
