Undercover Surveillance Techniques

This three-day course is designed for law enforcement officers assigned to a unit where conducting surveillance is part of their duties. Too often members are assigned to a specialized unit with little to no experience in surveillance techniques. Properly planned and executed surveillance missions greatly increase the probability of successful and important evidence gathering and followup on missions conducted against the targeted individual(s). During this program students will participate in practical exercises utilizing different surveillance methods incorporating foot surveillance, as well as mobile vehicle surveillance.
